- 4. Short Courses & Certificates Great for skill upgrades or migration points

Tip: Make sure the school is CRICOS-registered to ensure your qualification is recognized and valid for student visas.









Student Visa (Subclass 500)

- Best for: International students
- Notes: Requires Confirmation of Enrolment (COE) and health insurance

Skilled Independent Visa (Subclass 189)

- Best for: Professionals with in-demand skills
- Notes: Points-tested; no sponsor needed

Skilled Nominated Visa (Subclass 190)

- Best for: Skilled workers nominated by a state
- Notes: Requires state nomination

Business Innovation Visa (Subclass 188)

- Best for: Entrepreneurs and investors
- Notes: Must meet investment and business criteria

Partner Visa (Subclasses 820/801)

- Best for: Spouses or partners of Australians
- Notes: Requires proof of relationship history

Visitor Visa (Subclass 600)

- Best for: Tourists, family visits, or business visitors
- Notes: Allows short stays (up to 12 months); proof of funds and intent to return may be required

We recommend speaking with a registered migration agent to determine eligibility and increase your success.



MISTAKES TO AVOID DURING MIGRATION & SETTLEMENT

- X Submitting incomplete or incorrect documentation
- X Ignoring deadlines or visa conditions
- X Choosing the wrong course or provider
- X Relying on unverified advice or agents
- ➤ Not preparing financially for the first 6–12 months.
- X Underestimating cultural and emotional adjustment
